REPORT ON INTERNSHIP ORIENTATION PROGRAM

Internship Orientation Program is conducted every year on the first day of start of internship from the year 2016 to 2021, focusing on conduction of actual practice of oral health care and acquiring skills under supervision. During the program, the attendees are educated about the massive importance of internship period during later clinical practice and successful oral health care achievement in the society.

The event is presided by the Principal, Dr. George Varghese, the Director, Fr. Aby Vadakkumthala, the Vice Principal of academics, Dr. Biju Sebastian and the Vice Principal of administration, Dr. Benley George. The keynote speaker for the program is intern staff- incharge, Dr. Vinod Mathew.

The program starts off with the introductory speeches given by the dignitaries followed by the explanation of objectives of internship period by the keynote speaker and includes reinforcement of learning and acquisition of additional knowledge, achievement of basic skills, development of sound attitudes, understanding ethical principles, and initiating individual and group action for disease prevention and dental health promotion.

Interns are required to carry Log Book to the respective departments to record the daily work done, which is to be verified and approved by Head of Department of all departments at the end of internship.

Each of the nine departments have specified quota to be completed by all interns during the rotatory internship period -

- Oral Medicine and Radiology (1 month): Case history and radiographic exercises
- Periodontics: Prophylaxis, root planing and assessment of endo-perio cases
- Pediatric and Preventive Dentistry (1.5 months): Extraction, restoration, RCT, prophylaxis, application of fluoride in children below 12 years of age
- Conservative Dentistry and Endodontics (1.5 months): Routine restorative work, Restoration
 of extensively mutilated teeth, RCT of anterior teeth and management of deep carious
 lesions.
- Orthodontics and Dentofacial Orthopedics (1 month): Detailed diagnostic procedures, treatment planning, fabrication of removable appliances, orthodontic impressions and bite recording.
- Oral Pathology and Oral Microbiology (15 days): Haematology, article presentation, Ground sectioning and tissue processing.
- Prosthodontics and Crown & Bridge (2 month): Complete denture, removable and fixed partial dentures, relining and repair of broken dentures.
- Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery (2 month): Simple extractions, assisting transalveolar extractions, impactions, intermaxillary fixation, incision and drainage, biopsy, and performance of alveoloplasty.
- Public Health Dentistry (1 month): Short research project, Oral Health Education article,
 Radio Talk, clinical cases with demonstration, bystander motivation program.



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Interns are also required to attend regular Interns Knowledge Advancement Programme (IKAP) and periodic IGNITE sessions for optimal preparation of graduating dentists for the entire spectrum of heath care needs of the society.

On successful completion of internship, Internship Completion Certificate will be issued by office of the Principal followed by BDS degree awarded by the University.

In conclusion, the objective of excellent training during internship period has been imparted through the Internship Orientation Program to improve the training of graduating dentists and to make it more responsive to meeting community needs.
